**NINE FEDEX DRIVERS EARN HONORS
AT THE DELAWARE STATE TRUCK DRIVING CHAMPIONSHIP**
Winners Demonstrate Commitment to Safety and Professionalism

HARRINGTON, Del. – May 11, 2009 – Nine drivers representing FedEx Corp. (NYSE: FDX) operating companies placed among the winners at the 2009 Delaware State Truck Driving Championship in Harrington on May 16.

- **Michael Conaway**, a contractor for FedEx Home Delivery based in New Castle, captured the top spot in the Straight Truck class for the second straight year.
- **Joe LeBlanc**, a driver for FedEx Ground contractor Q&D Trucking in Salisbury, Md., won the Step Van class.
- FedEx Freight driver **Rusty Pederson** (Wilmington) earned the top spot in the Twins class.
- **Jenise Townsend** (New Castle), a driver for Michael Conaway, and **John Argo** (Salisbury), a driver for FedEx Ground contractor Travis Boardman, completed the FedEx sweep of the Step Van class by finishing second and third, respectively.
- Wilmington-based FedEx Freight drivers **Randy O'Dell** and **Chris McKnight** posted second-place finishes in the Twins and 4-Axles classes, respectively.
- FedEx Ground contractor **Bob Gilkerson** (Salisbury) finished third in the Twins class.
- **Louis Lockard**, a driver for FedEx Freight in Wilmington, was third in the 4-Axle class.

Conway, LeBlanc and Pederson will go on to compete at the American Trucking Associations' 2009 National Truck Driving Championships (NTDC), known as the "Super Bowl of Safety" August 18-22, 2009 in Pittsburgh. In addition, each state winner

will be recognized by FedEx as part of its safe driving initiative, *The Chairman's Challenge*.

The Delaware State Truck Driving Championship is an opportunity for professional truck drivers to demonstrate their driving skills and commitment to safety. The event includes a difficult driving skills test, pre-trip inspection and written examination covering vehicle operation and knowledge of federal safety regulations.

In 2008, 70 driving professionals from 36 states representing FedEx Freight, FedEx National LTL, FedEx Ground, FedEx Express and FedEx Custom Critical qualified to compete at the National Truck Driving Championships by winning their respective state's competition and driving accident-free for at least one year. FedEx drivers captured National Champion titles in the Tank Truck, 4-Axle and Twins classes and the NTDC Rookie of the Year honor. In addition, FedEx drivers earned three additional top-three finishes in their respective vehicle classes.
